Our PATH certified instructor, Lynnette Short shares that the first horse Augie interacted with, groomed and led was Paint. Paint is a gentle soul and loved the attention he received from Augie. Augie learned about different grooming tools and brushes and with support from his Mom and Lynnette. He seemed to enjoy his first lesson.

By Augie's second lesson, he was much more comfortable with the grooming tools and touching the horse. Augie, who is on the autism spectrum, really adapted wonderfully to his introduction to a new horse named Bailey. Bailey is a big, strong retired standardbred race horse. All involved were impressed how well Augie and Bailey hit it off as a team!

Augie led Bailey down the road to the Sensory Trail and they both enjoyed a relaxing fall stroll. The crunch of the fall leaves, warm breeze, calmness of the nature trail, were all sensations that provided a valuable experience for Augie.

Augie led his horse with support from Lynnette through the trail and back to the barn. For Augie and Bailey, a bond of familiarity and comfort has begun.

## Taya's Journey with Purple Pony

Taya has been participating in equine-assisted activities with Purple Pony Therapeutic Horsemanship for over nine years. She started her adventure with our therapy program riding our gentle but stubborn CJ. He would carry her ever so carefully around the arena and on walks along the Sensory Trail. He was a great pony for her to begin her adventure.

Taya would practice giving commands to CJ with a small color coded picture symbol felt board draped along CJ withers. With a prompt to her hand, Taya pats twice on the picture command "walk on' and along CJ goes. When time to stop, Taya pats twice on the picture symbol "whoa' and CJ stands at a stop. Taya frequently would look at her side walkers with a pout on her face expressing her disinterest in stopping her beloved pony as she always wanted him to keep moving!





#### **Spring Session 2023**

Taya has PURA Syndrome, an extremely rare neurodevelopmental disability. Her participation in Purple Pony lessons has helped with her hypotonia, communication and overall engagement with her side walkers and of course, her lesson horse. Her parents have shared that she can be sound asleep on her ride to the Purple Pony barn but as soon as they turn into the driveway and pull up next to the arena, she is awake and looking for her volunteers and horse. They say Taya has improved her core muscle strength and endurance.



"It's a wonderful feeling when our daughter's eyes light up and she starts clapping as we pull up to the Purple Pony's barn for her horse therapy. She grins from ear to ear when she's in the saddle, and absolutely loves the attention and interaction she gets from her team of volunteers. What's even more magical is that those rides have helped give her better stability and core strength to walk (with assistance)... something her doctor's doubted would ever happen. We are truly blessed to have Purple Ponies in Taya's life."

This year, Taya has begun lessons riding Bubba. Bubba, a lumbering, kind, sometimes befuddled Halflinger horse who behaves like a true gentleman during her lessons. Taya enjoys her rides with her favorite music playing in the background. This past fall Taya engaged in sunny walks on the Sensory Trail as she navigated the sensory activities and musical instrument stops.



Taya really enjoys the Sensory bridge with its different materials for the horse's hoofs to make noise on, for example wood chips, rocks, sand and a wooden bridge as she sits up and listens to each sound. The side walkers get a kick out of Taya' reaction as she smells mint, basil and lemon dill at the Herb Wall.
